


Have you ever felt like you just don't have enough? Not enough time, money, resources, or even faith? The story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 in the Gospel of Mark (Mark 6:30-44) speaks directly to this feeling. A vast crowd gathers, hungry and weary. The disciples see the problem and approach Jesus with a practical solution: "Send them away so they can buy food in the villages." Jesus, however, sees something more. He sees an opportunity to teach a profound lesson about abundance in the face of scarcity.

The key player in this story is often overlooked: a young boy with a meager lunch of five loaves and two fish. This small offering, freely given, becomes the catalyst for the miracle. Jesus asks the disciples to have the people sit down in groups. Imagine the scene – thousands arranged on the grassy hillside. Then, Jesus takes the boy's lunch, gives thanks, breaks the bread, and begins to distribute it. Miraculously, the food multiplies, reaching everyone. There's even leftover! The disciples initially focused on the lack, but Jesus showed them the power of faith and sharing.

When we face scarcity, whether physical or spiritual, let us remember the miracle of the loaves and fishes. Let us offer what we have, however small, trusting in God's abundant provision. And let us find sustenance in Jesus, the Bread of Life, who satisfies our soul's deepest longing.

# Even The Smallest Seed Planted Can Produce An Abundant Harvest!

Imagine a vast crowd, hungry and weary, gathered around Jesus. The disciples see the need, the impossibility of feeding them all. But a young boy steps forward, offering his meager lunch – five loaves and two fish. It seems insignificant compared to the task at hand.

Yet, Jesus takes the boy's offering. He doesn't dismiss it as insufficient. He asks the disciples to have the people sit down. This simple act – gathering in community – prepares them to receive not just food, but a miracle. Jesus blesses the small lunch, and as He does, it multiplies. There's enough, and more than enough, to feed the entire multitude.

This story teaches us several powerful lessons:

- **God uses the willing.** The boy, with his small act of faith, became an instrument of God's provision. We may feel our gifts are insignificant, but God can use them in mighty ways.
- **Faith over scarcity.** The disciples initially focused on what they lacked. But Jesus teaches us to trust in God's abundance, even when faced with limitations.
- **Sharing leads to multiplication.** The boy's willingness to share his lunch opened the door to a miracle. When we share what we have, even if it seems small, God's grace multiplies it for the benefit of others.

#### **Reflection:**

- What are the "five loaves and two fish" you possess that you can offer to God?
- How can you cultivate a spirit of generosity and share your gifts with others?
- When faced in lack, how can you trust in God's abundant provision?

Remember, even the smallest offering, given with faith and a willing heart, can be used by God to work miracles in our lives and the lives of others.

Know this... This is not a "slot machine theology" nor is it some kind of bless me scheme. It is simply an awareness of understanding the principles of seed-faith living and practicing them in your life!

#### God's Abundant Love!

"God showed how much he loved us by sending his only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. This is real love . . . he sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins." - 1 John 4:9–10

Everything in life changes—relationships, jobs, fame. One minute you feel like a hero; the next minute you feel like a zero. But there's one thing in the universe that will never change: God's love.



Knowing that God still loves you no matter what happens — your failures, your brokenness, your sin — provides a rock solid foundation in your life.

Consider the small word "so" that goes before "love" in the Bible's most famous verse, John 3:16. The verse says, "God so loved the world . . . " (NIV).

God loves you with an extravagant, lavish love that can never be taken away. It's beyond comprehension. He loves you on your good days and your bad days. He loves you when it's raining and when the sun is shining.

God says he doesn't want you to just recognize this lavish love intellectually. He wants you to recognize it emotionally. Love is God's nature. God created the universe and everything in it for no other reason than so he could love it. And God created you so he could love you.

In fact, in Jesus, God shows us what real love, his love, looks like. "God showed how much he loved us by sending his only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. This is real love . . . he sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins" (1 John 4:9–10).

Many people say they love you. God showed you how much he loves you. He loved you so much it hurt. He sacrificed his Son. When Jesus died for you, he was saying he loved you so much he'd rather die than live without you.

And the Bible says that's what real love, the kind of love that you can build your life upon, looks like. Real love makes sacrifices. Real love endures to the end. Real love gives all.

So if you have ever doubted God's love for you, focus on the extravagance what He has done for you. That's the kind of love only God has for you. And he's waiting with open arms to show you.

#### For Those Are Suffering

One of the most comforting truths of our faith is this: that God does not abandon us in our suffering.

And one of the biggest lies of our enemy and our own human misconceptions is this: That God *caused* the suffering and brought evil upon you.

Yes, we all suffer. Some of the most faithful Christians I know have endured great pain and

suffering. And yes, I know that because God is Redeemer, He can bring great good out of great suffering. But the God I know did not *give* you cancer, harm your kid, tempt the gunman, or send the hurricane to your city.

If that were the case, imagine how this would feel: the God you really needed to comfort you during your time of trial ... has been identified as the one who brought this hell upon you. It simply doesn't ring true.

If you are in emotional or physical pain today, know that God is not the source of your suffering. He is the source of your comfort, strength and your redemption!



In the world today, we must not be discouraged by the struggle it takes to build Christ's church. The forces of the devil will try to overcome it, but Jesus will prevail (Matthew 16:18). Remember what Jesus said: "Seek first [God's] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

It's not that God necessarily wants us to live in a bleak apartment without beautiful paneling. But if that's what it takes to build God's kingdom, we must be willing to sacrifice. Our treasures are in heaven!
