

Sowing Generously, Reaping Abundantly!

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."—2 Corinthians 9:6-7

In these verses, Paul offers a profound insight into the nature of giving and its consequences. He uses the imagery of sowing and reaping, a concept deeply rooted in agricultural societies but universally understood. Just as a farmer who scatters only a few seeds will harvest a small crop, so too, our giving produces a return in proportion to our generosity. But this isn't merely about the quantity; it's about the heart behind the giving.

The act of giving is much more than a financial transaction; it is a spiritual practice that reflects our trust in God. When we give generously, we acknowledge that everything we have comes from Him. Our resources—be it money, time, or talents—are gifts from God, entrusted to us not to hoard but to share. By giving generously, we align ourselves with God's nature, for He is the ultimate Giver, having given us His Son.

Paul emphasizes that our giving should not be done reluctantly or under compulsion. God isn't interested in begrudging gifts; He desires that we give out of a joyful heart. A cheerful giver understands that in God's economy, giving leads not to loss but to gain. When we give with the right attitude, we participate in a divine cycle: we give, God blesses, and we reap a harvest—often in ways that far exceed our expectations.

This principle challenges us to examine our own giving. Are we sowing sparingly or generously? Do we give out of obligation or with a cheerful heart? Generous giving is not measured by the amount but by the willingness and joy with which we give. It's an act of worship, a tangible expression of our faith in God's provision.

As you consider your giving, ask God to cultivate in you a spirit of generosity. Trust that He will not only meet your needs but will also bless you abundantly, so that you can continue to be a blessing to others. Remember, the seeds you sow today will yield a harvest that can impact lives, both now and for eternity.

"Heavenly Father, help me to be a cheerful and generous giver. Teach me to trust in Your provision and to give from a heart full of gratitude. May my giving reflect Your love and bring you glory. Amen

Are You Wrestling With God?

"Then Jacob was left alone; and a Man wrestled with him until the breaking of day... Jacob said, "I will not let You go unless You bless me!".... And He blessed him there. And Jacob called the name of the place Peniel: "For I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved." Genesis 12

In the most extreme moment of his life, when his entire household was threatened with annihilation, the Patriarch Jacob wrestled with a Man through an entire sleepless night.

Somehow, after this astounding encounter, Jacob came to the realization that he had been wrestling with God, and face to face! Once again, the Lord God of heaven showed Himself as a human being to a man He loved; this time, for the purpose of rescuing, blessing, and preserving the man's destiny.

Jacob was relentless during this struggle and his perseverance changed him profoundly, forever, in several ways: he was wounded and walked with a limp for the rest of his life, a sign of human weakness and dependence on the Lord; he was given a new name ("Israel") and with it a new identity, as a prince with God, and one whose struggle with the Almighty saved his life, his family, and his God given inheritance and posterity; and finally, Jacob received the long-awaited relief and closure with the brother whom he had deceived and enraged so many years before.

So this wrestling match with God was a massive turning point in Jacob's life, and though it must have taken every ounce of human effort he could muster, the victory he won affected every human being in history, since, of course, the Man that Jacob wrestled with was almost certainly the same Man who became his most important descendant, the Savior of the world, Yeshua, the Messiah; Jesus the Christ.

How often difficulties and crises are used by the Lord to bring us closer and to develop intimacy with Him. It is sometimes the Lord's will to draw us to Himself through extreme and even terrible circumstances or threats.

The inner transformation that can take place when we pass through these intense prayer battles, cannot perhaps, be accomplished any other way. But consider the fruit and the blessing which can result from these mighty wrestling's. And consider how being that close to God Himself may change you forever.

So, you who are gutting out that anguishing trial—don't let go until you receive the blessing, the change, the victory. I believe the Lord also wants to say to you— that you have struggled with God and with men— and have prevailed!


"Did you know that I have a sister who was left by a drunken husband with five children and no means to provide for them?" No, they said, they did not know that either."

Giving Back To God

The purpose of tithing is to teach us to always put God first in our lives. God doesn't need our money. He wants what it represents: our gratitude, our priorities and our faith. Look at these verses in Proverbs 3. Do you see where it says, 'Honor the Lord by giving him the leftovers of all your income'.. Now, you can see, that's NOT what it says at all.

It says, "Honor the Lord with your possessions and with the first produce of your entire harvest ..". We give to God first, right off the top of our income. And here is the promise, "Then your barns will be completely filled, and your vats will overflow with new wine".

As committed believers, we are called to give the first 10% to God. If we're going to be in debt, we will be in debt to other people, but should not be in be in debt to God. You and I are called to give back to God in gratitude, but also as a demonstration of our priorities. And, it is a demonstration of our faith in his promises.

In Malachi 3:10, God says, "Bring all the tithes into the storehouse ...". That means the place where you worship. Then God says, "Put me to the test!" In a sense, 'Test me and see how I will bless you for your obedience" God says he will provide all that you need. He doesn't say he'll provide all that we greed, but all that we need.
