

In John 14:27, Jesus offers His disciples a profound gift: "Peace."

This peace is not circumstantial or fleeting; it's rooted in the very nature of Christ. The peace Jesus gives transcends our human understanding because it is anchored in His presence, not in the absence of conflict or difficulty.

In a world full of uncertainty, we often seek peace through control, possessions, or relationships. Yet, Jesus invites us to receive His peace, which stands firm even when everything around us is shaken. His peace calms the storms within, granting us rest for our souls (Matthew 11:28-29).

The Peace That Jesus Offers

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." — John 14:27

When we think about peace, our minds often go to external circumstances: quiet surroundings, lack of conflict, or the absence of stress. Yet, the peace Jesus offers is something much deeper, something that can sustain us even in the most chaotic moments of life.

The peace of Jesus is distinct from the peace the world offers. Worldly peace is often temporary, dependent on circumstances going right. When we are healthy, financially secure, and our relationships are harmonious, we feel at peace. But this peace is fragile. One bad day at work, one disagreement, or one unexpected crisis, and that peace evaporates.

The peace of Jesus, however, is not rooted in external factors. It flows from His unchanging nature and His promise to be with us always. Jesus says, "My peace I give you." This is a personal peace that comes directly from His heart to ours. It's the peace He experienced while facing the cross—grounded in complete trust in the Father's will.

Jesus knows that we will face trouble in this life. In John 16:33, He says, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Notice that He doesn't promise a trouble-free life, but He promises victory over those troubles. The peace He offers is not an escape from difficulty, but a calm assurance in the midst of it. It is the knowledge that even when life feels out of control, Jesus holds us in His hands.

Think about the story in Mark 4:35-41, when Jesus and His disciples were caught in a furious storm. While the disciples panicked, Jesus was asleep in the boat, perfectly at peace. His peace was not due to a lack of awareness of the storm, but because He knew His authority over it. After calming the storm, He asked His disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" (Mark 4:40).

When we experience anxiety, fear, or uncertainty, we can draw near to Jesus through prayer and scripture, trusting that His peace is available to us at every moment. Notice that this peace is not just an emotional calm—it is a guard over our hearts and minds. It protects us from being overwhelmed by fear, worry, or doubt.

Take some time today to reflect on where you need Jesus' peace in your life. Bring your worries and fears before Him, and allow His peace to guard your heart and mind. He is waiting to give you the gift of His peace.


Sedgefield Elementary

Discerning God's Will

"How can I discover God's will for my life?"
"How can I be sure God's guiding my decisions?"
"God, what do you want me to do?"

Practically all followers of Jesus ask questions like these. Sometimes we think these thoughts randomly, but more often than not, we focus more when faced with important crossroads in our lives, when we're trying to sort out the best path forward.

But is that really the best view of discerning God's will: something we do at the "crisis" points in life? Truly discerning the will of God more as a process than as something we do only at crisis points. We are also wise to heed Jesus' parable of the unjust steward, realizing that if we're faithful in little, we'll be faithful with much.

Especially when struggles set in and things dry up around you, is this a necessarily sign to act and move on? That is what your natural mind will perceive to be true. Yet scripture reminds our spiritual mind of a much deeper and lasting truth.

In Genesis 26 we read that there was a severe drought and famine in the land, Isaac believed that going into another place such as Egypt would help sustain his family. But God spoke and directed his steps in a very different way. He commanded him to stay right where he was, and to sow seed.


Isaac obeyed the Lord and stayed in the land while famine was all around him. Then the Bible says that "Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year a hundredfold: and the Lord blessed him" (Genesis 26:12).

Imagine this remarkable picture of a man sowing amid the desolation, a stark and barren land. Sowing in the belief that God would provide a bountiful harvest in spite of the famine gripping his homeland. Most likely, his neighbors thought he was a madman to be sowing seed while the land was dry and dead.

Yet he relied on the promise of God, who said, "I will be with thee, and I will bless thee." It is only for believers with faith for the miraculous that can begin to harvest such a miraculous supply.

I believe God is pouring His abundance into your hands, just as He did for Isaac. But you have to be obediently waiting in the place he has placed you to receive the blessing.

If you look at the circumstances of your situation, it might seem like a good time to store up, hold back, go somewhere else and play it safe. Don't! Obey God, plant more seed in the drought and get ready for a miracle harvest!



All Things Are Possible!

"Jesus looked at them and said, 'With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." – Matthew 19:26

The future must have seemed hopeless for George Washington Carver. He lived during a time when there were few opportunities and overwhelming obstacles for African-Americans.

Born on a farm in Missouri around 1864, he had a difficult childhood. His body was frail, and he often was sick. He never really knew his natural father. While still an infant, Carver – along with his sisters and mother – was kidnapped by raiders. Although he was rescued, the others died or disappeared.

Yet Carver did not allow these obstacles to stand in his way. He demonstrated determination and a drive to learn. He eventually graduated from Iowa Agricultural College where he taught before moving on to Tuskegee College in Alabama.

In spite of what seemed like impossible barriers, Carver went on to make many amazing discoveries, including hundreds of innovative uses for peanuts, soybeans, pecans, and sweet potatoes. He also developed a crop rotation method that revolutionized agriculture.

What was his secret? Faith in God. He prayed, "those whom He has redeemed learn to walk with Him not only daily or hourly," but moment by moment. He asked God for wisdom "to do His will." Carver simply believed that all things were possible.

Think about your life. Whatever you face, trust in God. Don't limit Him. Fill your mind with His Word, and be ready to step out in faith. Believe that He will answer your prayers. If you ask, all things are possible.
