

#### Called To Be Ambassadors

"We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God." 2 Corinthians 5:20

The term "ambassador" carries significant weight. In the earthly realm, ambassadors represent their countries, acting on their behalf and carrying the authority of their government. As

followers of Christ, we are called to a similar role. Our identity as ambassadors means that we are not just passive believers; we are active participants in God's mission. Consider the implications of being an ambassador for Christ. This role implies a relationship with Him that is both intimate and profound. We are entrusted with the message of reconciliation—an invitation to experience God's love and grace. Each day, we can reflect His character and make His appeal known in our words, actions, and attitudes.

The verse emphasizes the appeal of reconciliation. In a world often marked by division, conflict, and misunderstanding, our call is to be agents of peace. Reconciliation is more than just a momentary agreement; it is a deep, transformative process that restores relationships.

As ambassadors, we are called to embody the spirit of reconciliation, starting with our relationship with God and extending to others. Reflect on the areas in your life where you may need to seek reconciliation—perhaps with a friend, family member, or even within yourself. God's heart is for us to experience wholeness, and we can extend that same invitation to others.

Being an ambassador requires us to be aware of how we represent Christ in our daily lives. It calls us to reflect His values and priorities. How can we embody the love, mercy, and truth of Christ in practical ways? This could mean showing kindness to a stranger, being honest in our dealings, or standing up for justice.

Consider the following questions:

How do my words reflect Christ's message?

In what ways can I show love and grace to those around me?

Am I willing to step out of my comfort zone to share the Gospel?

Remember, our role as ambassadors is not based on our perfection but on our willingness to allow God to work through us. It's about living out our faith authentically, acknowledging our shortcomings, and relying on the Holy Spirit for guidance.

#### **Personal Application**

Take a moment to think about your sphere of influence. Who has God placed in your life that needs to hear the message of reconciliation? It could be a coworker, a neighbor, or even a family member. Pray for opportunities to share God's love with them.

#### **Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes**

This year we are going to be packing Shoeboxes online instead of purchasing the items and packing them ourselves.

Shoeboxes built online go to the ends of the earth to children in some of the hardest-to -reach places—whether deep jungles, city slums, steep mountainsides, or one of more than 1,000 remote Pacific islands. Many of these areas are resistant to the Gospel, for cultural or religious reasons, and are home to numerous unreached people groups, some of whom have never heard the Name of Jesus Christ. Online boxes are carefully prepared, abiding by strict customs regulations to safeguard partners who will deliver the gifts, as well as the boys and girls who receive them.

Here are the instructions to pack a Shoebox. We ask that you use the link below or the QR code so that HBC will get credit for the boxes.

Choose a 'girl' or 'boy'


Choose the child's age

Choose 3 Small Toys, then click 'Next'

Choose 2 Accessories, then click 'Next'



On the next screen you can 'build another box' or 'continue'

After you continue, a pop-up box will ask if you would like to support this program on a monthly basis or support the discipleship program.

This is not required. Click 'Done'

The last screen reviews your gift(s), asks for your billing information (your personal address) and your payment information.

If you do not want to build your own box, you can still donate money and we will build it for you in your name.





T - Is it true?


 $\mathbf{H}$  – Is it helpful?

#### "God's House vs. Our House"

"Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin?" — <u>Haggai 1:3-4</u>

After the Jews returned from exile in Babylon, they began to prosper. They started rebuilding the temple which had been ruined by the Babylonians. But the people of other religions who lived in the land sent letters to Babylon and complained that the Jews were preparing to revolt. For that and other reasons, the rebuilding of the temple stopped.

It seems that the Jews began with a will to rebuild the temple, but when opposition arose, they faltered and lost focus. They transferred their energy to building and beautifying their own houses. It took the searing words of Haggai to call them back to the priority of rebuilding God's temple.

In the world today, we must not be discouraged by the struggle it takes to build Christ's church. The forces of the devil will try to overcome it, but Jesus will prevail (Matthew 16:18). Remember what Jesus said: "Seek first [God's] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

It's not that God necessarily wants us to live in a bleak apartment without beautiful paneling. But if that's what it takes to build God's kingdom, we must be willing to sacrifice. Our treasures are in heaven!
