

In Ephesians 2:10, we are reminded that we are God's handiwork—His masterpiece. This means that you are not an accident; your life has been crafted with purpose.

Each of us is uniquely designed with our own strengths, experiences, and passions. God has intentionally placed within you the gifts to fulfill the role He has planned for you. You are loved, valued, and worthy, not because of what you do but because of who you are in Him.

"Created as God's Masterpiece"

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Ephesians 2:10

I don't know about you, but my perception of myself seems, at times spiraling out of control. This verse is a powerful reminder of our identity and purpose in Christ.

The term "handiwork" or "masterpiece" (translated from the Greek word "poiema") signifies that we are not random products of chance but intentional creations, lovingly designed by God. Just as a skilled artist invests time and passion into their work, God has intricately fashioned each of us with care and intention.

Understanding that we are created to be God's masterpieces reshapes how we view ourselves. It challenges the negative narratives that the world often imposes on us. We may struggle with feelings of inadequacy or comparison, but in Christ, we are affirmed as valuable and cherished is .

As I so often say, each one of us is "a case for grace." Our worth is not defined by achievements, status, or the opinions of others; it is rooted in the love of the Creator who made you uniquely you. And our growth into who we were meant to be is not through our works. It is solely through the transformative and loving grace of God.

The verse also speaks to our purpose—"to do good works." This is not a call to mere activity, but a summons to meaningful living. Good works are the natural outflow of a life transformed by Christ. They encompass acts of kindness, service, and love that reflect God's heart to the world. These works are not random tasks but are specifically designed by God, prepared in advance for each of us. This speaks to the divine orchestration of our lives; nothing in your journey is without purpose.

Being "created in Christ Jesus" emphasizes the transformative power of our relationship with Him. It is through Christ that we are made new, equipped to walk in our purpose. As we grow in our faith, we become more attuned to His voice, leading us to the good works He has set before us.

Dear Heavenly Father, Thank You for the incredible truth that I am Your masterpiece, created with intention and love. Help me to see myself as You see me, free from the chains of insecurity and doubt. May I embrace the unique gifts and calling You have placed in my life. Guide my steps today as I seek to fulfill the good works You have prepared for me. Open my eyes to the opportunities around me. to reflect Your love and grace. I pray that my actions will bring glory to You and serve as a beacon of hope to others. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

Trunk or Treat- Thursday, October 31st 5:30pm-7:30pm



Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes

This year we are going to be packing Shoeboxes online instead of purchasing the items and packing them ourselves.

Shoeboxes built online go to the ends of the earth to children in some of the hardest-to -reach places—whether deep jungles, city slums, steep mountainsides, or one of more than 1,000 remote Pacific islands. Many of these areas are resistant to the Gospel, for cultural or religious reasons, and are home to numerous unreached people groups, some of whom have never heard the Name of Jesus Christ. Online boxes are carefully prepared, abiding by strict customs regulations to safeguard partners who will deliver the gifts, as well as the boys and girls who receive them.

Here are the instructions to pack a Shoebox. We ask that you use the link below or the QR code so that HBC will get credit for the boxes.

There is a 'team' site to use to pack shoeboxes just for HBC!!

Click on the green box "Build a Shoebox Online Now"

Click on the green box "Start Building"

Choose a 'girl' or 'boy'


Choose the child's age

Click the 'Essentials' into the shoebox, then click 'Next'

Choose 1 Wow Item, then click 'Next'

Choose 3 Small Toys, then click 'Next'

Choose 2 Accessories, then click 'Next'



On the next screen you can 'build another box' or 'continue'

After you continue, a pop-up box will ask if you would like to support this program on a monthly basis or support the discipleship program.

This is not required. Click 'Done'

The last screen reviews your gift(s), asks for your billing information (your personal address) and your payment information.

If you do not want to build your own box, you can still donate money and we will build it for you in your name.

You Can't "Make" Me Feel The Way I Do...

Your feelings aren't necessarily true and you DO have control over them.

It's hard to ignore the power of your feelings. Modern media encourages this thinking with phrases like, "follow your heart," but God advises to be mindful of what your heart tells you.

Not all emotions are harmful. The Bible tells of at least 20 emotions Jesus felt including affection, anguish,

anger, compassion, distress, grief, gladness, indignation, joy, love, peace, sadness, sympathy, and weariness.

But Jesus didn't allow others to control His emotions. No one can MAKE you angry; no one can MAKE you love them; no one can MAKE you worry, and no one can MAKE you happy. Guard your heart and let only God influence your feelings.

Make the decision to react or respond in ways that bring honor to God. Choose the fruits of the spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23).

When you let God drive your decisions and reactions, peace begins to blossom. You become more grounded, the negative turns positive, and joy fills your heart. Compare your emotions to the Word of God. If the two don't agree, your heart is deceiving you just as the Bible warns.

When God Answers Prayer


After starting a new diet I altered my drive to work to avoid passing my favorite bakery.

What Is Pleasing To Him

I find it interesting that quite often, people attempt to enhance their relationship with God by trying not to do things they believe "break God's rules" for how to live. They see God as a tyrant, pointing His finger at them, and commanding in a deep, stern voice, "Thou Shalt Not!!" They spend their life trying to avoid lightning bolts of judgment from above!

The reality is, that kind of living is completely the opposite of how we should act, and how God desires us to live our lives. Rather than attempting to avoid doing things that displease God, we need to discipline ourselves to instead seek to find the best ways to please God! And, the more we succeed in doing what pleases Him, the less inclined we will be to do what displeases Him.

What a wonderful prayer we find in Hebrews 13:20-21, asking God to "equip you with everything good for doing his will," and to "work in us what is pleasing to Him!" I am so glad that the Lord does give us everything we "need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19) With that in mind, it only makes sense that we discover and put into practice the very things that please God!

Tests are Temporary



In the meantime, let God train you. He watches the way you handle the little jobs. Jesus promised in Matthew 25:21, "If you are faithful over a few matters, I will set you over many."



Do you aspire to great things? Excel in the small things. Don't complain. Let others grumble. Not you. When you're given a task, take it. When you see a hurt, address it. Compassion matters to God.

This is the time for service, not self-centeredness. Cancel the pity party. Love the people God brings to you. He will work in you what is pleasing to Himself.



"God's House vs. Our House"

"Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin?" — <u>Haggai 1:3-4</u>

After the Jews returned from exile in Babylon, they began to prosper. They started rebuilding the temple which had been ruined by the Babylonians. But the people of other religions who lived in the land sent letters to Babylon and complained that the Jews were preparing to revolt. For that and other reasons, the rebuilding of the temple stopped.

It seems that the Jews began with a will to rebuild the temple, but when opposition arose, they faltered and lost focus. They transferred their energy to building and beautifying their own houses. It took the searing words of Haggai to call them back to the priority of rebuilding God's temple.

In the world today, we must not be discouraged by the struggle it takes to build Christ's church. The forces of the devil will try to overcome it, but Jesus will prevail (Matthew 16:18). Remember what Jesus said: "Seek first [God's] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

It's not that God necessarily wants us to live in a bleak apartment without beautiful paneling. But if that's what it takes to build God's kingdom, we must be willing to sacrifice. Our treasures are in heaven!
