


When Answers To Prayer Are Delayed...

"Then he said to me, 'Do not be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day that you set your mind to gain understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in response to them." Daniel 11:12

This verse offers a powerful insight into the nature of prayer and spiritual warfare. When Daniel prayed, God heard him immediately. However, there was a delay because the angel delivering the message faced opposition from spiritual forces. This

teaches us that prayer is not just about what happens immediately in the physical world; it also engages us in a much larger, unseen spiritual battle.

When we pray, our words are heard by God the moment they leave our hearts. But prayer also stirs things in the unseen realm—God's angels may be dispatched to assist us, but they are often met with resistance. This does not mean God is slow to act, but rather that prayer is part of a larger cosmic struggle. God always responds—sometimes instantly, sometimes in ways we don't understand at first, but He is always faithful to respond.

When we pray, we can be assured that God is at work behind the scenes, even when we can't see the immediate results. Sometimes God is preparing us, or there are greater spiritual forces at play that need to align before we see His full answer.

Daniel waited twenty-one days for an answer, but when it came, it was exactly what he needed to hear. God's timing is not our timing, but His timing is always perfect. When we pray, we surrender our sense of timing and trust that God's timing will reveal itself at just the right moment

There may be times when you feel as though your prayers are bouncing off the ceiling, or when God feels distant. Perhaps you've been praying for something specific—health, a loved one's salvation, wisdom for a decision—and it seems like there's no answer. But like Daniel, we must trust that our prayers are heard, and that God is working even when we can't see the full picture.

God is always present, always listening, and always at work—even in the invisible realms. And like the angel's message to Daniel, *God's response will come in due time*! Until then, continue to pray with faith, knowing that your words are not wasted. They are part of a divine conversation with the Creator of the universe, and in ways beyond your understanding, He is moving on your behalf

Yes, our God is always at work, whether we perceive it or not. Daniel's example shows us that persistence in prayer and humility before God align us with His will, and in due time, His response will come. Keep praying, for God hears you and is working on your behalf.

It Takes Just One

In 1520, one person stepped off a Spanish ship in Mexico and caused the deaths of thousands of people. The man was a soldier under the leadership of Pánfilo de Narváez, and he had smallpox. The soldier didn't know it, but wherever he went he exposed the citizens to a new disease. As a result of the ensuing smallpox epidemic, many thousands of

Mexican citizens died.

One man. That's all it took. His contact with the unsuspecting Mexican people led to a horrible, painful scourge. The devastating effects of that disease traveled from one person to another, infecting a large segment of the population.

The spread of any deadly disease is similar to the spread of a spiritual sickness that sometimes strikes churches—the disease of gossip and unedifying words (Ephesians 4:29, 30, 31, 32).

It's not unusual for a happy and well-adjusted congregation of people to be infected after just one person introduces gossip. Soon dissension is running rampant among people who had been eagerly working together, and the church finds itself spending more time on damage control than on ministry.

Each of us should be careful not to spread the sickness of gossip. Instead, let's use our words to strengthen and encourage one another.

Dealing With Anxiety

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7



Whether we are lifelong Christians, or new Christians who have just come to know the love of God, especially during these difficult days, we can all struggle with the same thing: dealing with anxiety and trusting God.

Even beyond the accentuated concerns of the Covid19 virus, we have all had situations in our lives when we have struggled to put our trust in God. Whether it's a situation at work, a prayer that God hasn't seemed to answer, or a big decision we have to make, we have all found ourselves searching for the right answer on our own instead of trusting that God has a plan.

I didn't have the privilege of growing up in what I would consider a Christ-centered home. My dad was a good and honorable man, but he was very quiet about his beliefs and was never a church goer as such. My mother was of a quieter temperament herself by nature, however she did see the need and blessing of church attendance. So, I was enrolled in the nursery and grew up in the church with various role models there to guide me in the development of my faith.

So, I am especially grateful for the local church where I grew up because it was there where I found godly examples of how to put my trust in God and how to put my faith in him. But, like most people, even with that good spiritual foundation, I have found myself in seasons of spiritual dryness and lacking trust in God with situations in my life.

Trusting God's plan often doesn't happen automatically. It's a choice and a commitment I have to make daily to focus on God in my situations and to thank him for what he has done and what he will do.

Proverbs 46 tells us to "trust in the Lord with all our heart and lean not on our own understanding." No matter our circumstances, our gaze should remain the same: focused on the power of the Christ and wanting his will to be done in our lives.

As for the freedom from anxiety and the peace we are seeking, it will never be found in terms of our intellectual pursuits alone. The peace Christ offers is that which "surpasses understanding" according to Philippians 4:7. It by passes our minds and goes deep into our spirits where the core of our emotions may be found. It is here that our bondage to fear and anxiety are broken and we are set free by the power of Christ!
