Lots of people identify as Christians—about one-third of the world, in fact. But calling ourselves Christians and actually following Jesus can be two different things. Without even realizing it, we can slip into a faith that's more about appearances than about a life-changing relationship with Christ.

Our new series, "Christian—ish" challenges people to confront how they may be practicing a compromised version of Christianity: one in which comfort, convenience, or cultural norms overshadow true faith, obedience, and transformation. Each week, we'll tackle a different way this can show up in our lives. We will explore what it is like to go from shallow faith to a deeper, more committed relationship with Jesus.



# The Cost of True Discipleship vs. Comfortable Christianity

It's easy to become comfortable in the world we live in. We've been taught that life is about success, security, and stability. As a result, it's tempting to accept a version of Christianity that doesn't challenge us too deeply, a faith that fits neatly into our comfortable lives without demanding too much. But as I reflect on what it truly means to follow Christ; I realize that the call to be a fully devoted follower of Jesus requires so much more.

A fully devoted follower of Christ doesn't just follow when it's convenient or easy. Jesus never promised a life of ease for His

followers. Instead, He spoke of carrying a cross, of losing one's life to gain it, of loving one's enemies, and of serving the least of these. He didn't call us to a comfortable existence but to a radical, self-sacrificial way of life that reflects His heart.

I think about the rich young ruler in Matthew 19:16-22, who came to Jesus asking what he must do to have eternal life. He challenged the ruler to give up what he held most dear—his wealth—and to follow Him. This challenge was not about money itself, but about the heart. Jesus knew that the ruler's possessions had become the focus of his life's priorities.

Experiencing "comfortable Christianity" is to have a substitute religion that avoids sacrifice, and change. It's a false version of the gospel that allows us to maintain our status quo, a faith that feels good but doesn't require transformation. But that's not the faith Jesus calls us to.

On the other hand, being a fully devoted follower of Christ is about more than just attending church or saying the right things. It's about surrendering our lives to Him daily, seeking His will above our own, and being willing to live radically for His kingdom. It means loving when it's hard, serving when it's inconvenient, forgiving when it's impossible, and giving when we feel we have nothing left to give.

It's about trusting Jesus enough to step into the unknown and walk in obedience, even when the world around us tells us to pursue comfort and personal success. It's about choosing His way over our own, even when that means making sacrifices. The call to follow Christ is not a call to a life of ease—it's a call to a life of purpose, of surrender, and of faithfulness, no matter the cost.

Today, let's be reminded that being a follower of Christ is not about being comfortable; it's about being transformed. It's about living in a way that reflects His love, His grace, and His sacrifice. And though it may be challenging, we know that the reward of following Him—both in this life and the next—is worth every step of the journey.





#### A Special Grace In Love

That special "someone" came up and embraced you. They gave you a kiss on the cheek unexpectedly. You remember how exceptional the feeling was.

We can dress it up with theological terms, clothe it with religious dogma, explain it in foreign Greek words such as "agape" for love, and "charis" for grace, or romantic Latin phrases such as, "Amor in perpetuum vivit dei gratia" meaning, "Love lives forever by the grace of God…" (I know that last one had to impress you!)

But when all is said and done, it all boils down to, "Because I love you..." That's GRACE... pure and simple.

And I am feeling these days that in our pursuit of deeper revelations, more meaningful experiences with God, deeper relationship connection with the divine persona above us and the human community around us, we might most fundamentally be best served by returning to step one -GRACE!

And we ask "Why?"... "Because, I love you!" God responds.

That is what God said to humanity when he entered our flesh though an infant presence in Bethlehem's manger and exited through the agony of Calvary's cruel cross. The divinity so majestically restrained in the physical body of Jesus was ravishly released in the resurrection and then poured out from heaven upon all flesh at Pentecost to splash upon the human timeline this era we call grace!

And how will respond today – in such a time as this? Perhaps resonating with the words penned by songwriter Gloria Gaither:

I then shall live as one who's been forgiven. I'll walk with joy to know my debts are paid.

I know my name is clear before my Father; I am His child and I am not afraid.

So, greatly pardoned, I'll forgive my brother;


The law of love I gladly will obey.

#### The Way to Pray
